



2. Heed Warnings

3. Cleaning

Unplug the TV from the wall outlet before cleaning. Do not use liquid, abrasive, or aerosol cleaners. Cleaners can permanently damage the cabinet and screen. Use a lightly dampened cloth for cleaning.

4. Wall Mount Bracket

Wall mount bracket is only available for some models. If wall mount bracket is not supplied with this product, you can buy it at the local market.

Please refer to the installing the wall mount bracket page of Quick Setup Guide for dimensions.

5. Water and Moisture

Avoid dripping or splashing of liquids onto the product. Objects filled with liquids, such as vases, should not be placed on the product.

6. Setting

Do not place this TV on an unstable cart, stand or table. Placing the TV on an unstable base can cause the TV to fall, resulting in serious personal injuries as well as damage to the TV. Use only a cart, stand, bracket or table recommended by the manufacturer or salesperson.

7. Ventilation

Slots and openings in the cabinet are provided for ventilation, to ensure reliable operation of the TV and to protect it from overheating. Do not cover the ventilation openings in the cabinet and never place the set in a confined space such as built-in cabinet unless proper ventilation is provided. Leave a minimum 10cm gap all around the unit, the rear of the TV should be 6cm away from the wall.

Power Source

This TV should be operated only from the type of power source indicated on the marking label. If you are not sure of the type of power supplied to your home, consult your appliance dealer or local power company.

9. Power-Cord Protection

Power- supply cords should be routed so that they are not likely to be walked on or pinched by items placed upon or against them, paying particular attention to cords at plug, wall outlets, and the point where they exit from the TV. MAIN plug on the power cord is used as the disconnect device, the disconnect device and socket-outlet shall be easily accessible.

10. Lightning

For added protection for this TV during a lightning storm, or when it is left unattended and unused for long periods of time, unplug it from the wall outlet and disconnect the antenna or cable system. This will prevent damage to the TV due to lightning or power-line surge.

11. Power Lines

An outside antenna system should not be located in the vicinity of overhead power lines or other electric light or power circuits, or where it can fall into such power lines or circuits. While installing an outside antenna system, extreme care should be taken to keep from touching such power lines or circuits as contact with them might be fatal.

12. Overloading

Do not overload wall outlets and extension cords as this can result in a risk of fire or electric shock.

Notes about prevention from damage of OLED TV screens

· Image retention

OLED TVs are prone to image retention due to the characteristics of the materials used. If the image repeatedly displays at the same position on the screen, or display time is too long, image retention may occur, which is not a TV malfunction.

Please avoid the following operations for a long time, which may cause image retention:

- There are black bars content on the top, bottom, left, and right of the screen.
- There are still images such as photos.
- There are video games with some still contents and pictures.
- There are picture menu, programme guide, channel identification, etc.
- There are static content of the application.

Reducing the risk of image retention

- It is recommended to turn off the TV normally by pressing the remote control.
- Avoid using it for a long time in non-full-screen zoom mode and small window playback mode.
- Avoid displaying still images, clocks, or logos with bright colours (including white) on any part of the screen.
- Set the image settings according to the environmental conditions. In the case of using it at home, as well as watching the TV station logo which often shows, etc., standard images are recommended.

Other functions

When displaying still images, clocks, bright colours or logos, etc., the screen brightness is automatically reduced, which is not a TV malfunction.

Installing the Stand or Wall mount bracket


(1) CAUTION

- Be sure to disconnect the AC power cord before installing a stand or wall mount brackets.
- The display on your TV is fragile. Make sure the TV screen is not scratched or damaged by hard objects or from pressure.
- After the installation is completed, make sure the TV is steady on a table or firmly attached to a wall mount, before removing all protective film, if any.


Installing the stand

Follow the illustrations and instructions below to complete the installation steps:

- 1. Carefully place your TV facedown on a soft, flat surface to prevent damage to the TV or scratching to the screen.
- 2. Raise the Base Cover, take it off and put it aside. The place that the Base Cover is at is used for fixing the Base Stand.




3. Using the 4 screws in the accessory bag, secure Part A and Part B as the following figure shows.




Installing the Stand or Wall mount bracket


4. Secure the Base Stand to the TV with the 4 screws in accessory tightly.



5. Restore the Base Cover at the place shown in the figure.



- 6. After the installation is completed, place the TV on a flat surface.
 - The TV is equipped with a swivel stand, and you can horizontally swivel the TV screen within 25°. Vertical swiveling is prohibited.
- · Swivel to a viewing angle of your preference.
- Carefully hold the both bottom corners of the TV to swivel. If you hold only one side, the screen may be damaged and the TV may fall over.
- When swivel the TV screen, do not pinch the screen with your hand.


Installing the wall mount bracket

Before mounting the TV, remove the TV stand if you have already attached it, and make sure the wall mount bracket supports the weight of your TV.


(!) CAUTION

When mounting the TV on a wall, follow instructions provided with the wall mount bracket. If it is not correctly mounted, the TV may fall and cause property damage or personal injury.

- · Place spacers between the TV and bracket.
- · Standard dimensions are shown below.



 We do not recommend hanging the TV on a slanted wall, and when wall mounting make sure your television remains parallel to the wall and does not lean forward.








Making Connections

► LAN (Wired setup)

Connect your TV to your network by connecting the LAN port on the back of your TV to an external modem or router using a LAN (Ethernet/Cat 5) cable. See the illustration below.

It is recommended to use a modem or router that supports Dynamic Host Configuration Protocol (DHCP). Modems and routers that support DHCP automatically provide the IP address, subnet mask, gateway, and DNS, so you don't have to enter them manually. Most home networks already have DHCP.



Wireless setup

To connect your TV to your network wirelessly, you need a wireless router or modem. See the illustration below.


The built-in Wireless LAN Adapter supports the IEEE 802.11 a/b/g/n/ac/ax communication protocols. It is recommended to use IEEE 802.11ax router. Low transfer rates for b/g may have the influence on the quality of streamed videos and other media.



→ NOTE

- You must use the built-in Wireless LAN Adapter to use a wireless network because the set doesn't support external USB network adapters.
- If the wireless router supports DHCP, your TV can connect with more ease to the wireless network.
- If you apply a security system other than the systems listed below, it will not work with the TV.
 - Security system: WPA, WEP, WPA2.
- In order to guarantee smooth network, the distance between router and TV should be less than 10 metres.


- Before you insert/remove the CI+ module, ensure that the TV is switched off. Then insert the CI card into the CI+ module in accordance with the Service Provider's instructions.
- Do not repeatedly insert or remove the Common Access Module as this may damage the interface and cause a malfunction.
- You must obtain a CI+ module and card from the service provider of the channels you want to watch.
- Insert the CI+ module with the SmartCard in the direction marked on the module and SmartCard.
- CI+ is not supported in some countries and regions; check with your authorized dealer.




- When connecting a hard disk or a USB hub, always connect the mains adapter of the connected device to the power supply. Exceeding a total current consumption may result in damage. The USB 1.1 and USB 2.0 devices maximum current consumption are 500mA. The USB 3.0 device maximum current consumption is 1A.
- For individual non-standard high-capacity mobile hard disk, if its impulse current is greater than or equal 1A, it may cause TV-rebooting or self-locking. So the TV does not support it.
- · The USB port supports a voltage of 5V.
















Installing Batteries in the Remote Control



1. Slide the back cover to open the battery compartment of the remote control.



 Insert two AA or AAA size batteries. Make sure to match the (+) and (-) ends of the batteries with the (+) and (-) ends indicated in the battery compartment.



3. Close the battery compartment with the cover.

Product image is only for reference, actual product may vary in appearance.

Handling the Batteries

- Incorrect use of batteries may cause corrosion or battery leakage, which could cause fire, personal injury or damage to property.
- Only use the battery type indicated in this manual. Whether to use AA or AAA size batteries, please refer to the actual remote control.
- Do not mix old and new batteries or different types of batteries.
- Do not dispose of used batteries as domestic waste. Dispose of them in accordance with local regulations.

▶ Pairing the Remote Control (only for Bluetooth remote control)


Pair the remote to the TV after you power it on. Keep the remote control within 3 metres from the TV. Press any button (except power and mic button) to pair.

→ NOTES

- · In special cases, press and hold [] button to pair.
- If an unknown error occurred with the remote, then it could have been caused by interference. Try to remove what's causing the interference and pair it again.
- If an unknown error occurred in the remote control while the battery power is normal, you can take out the batteries, press any key for 1~2 seconds, and insert them back. Then the remote control will work normally.
- The remote cannot be paired to the TV while the TV is in standby mode.

▶ Remote Control Operation Range

- 1. The remote control can work at a distance of up to 8 metres in front of the TV set.
- The remote control angle: taking the remote sensor as an apex, 6 metres away, its controlled horizontal angle is within ±30°, while the vertical angle is within ±15°.
- 3. The operating distance may vary depending on the brightness of the room.
